## THE BRONX MUSEUM DICTIONARY

This cohort of the Bronx Museum's Teen Council engaged with each other in artistic collaboration and critique through printmaking, zine making, and bookmaking throughout the Fall 2024 semester. Meeting and working with artists connected to The Bronx Museum, such as typographer Lynne Yun and exhibiting artist Futura 2000, sparked many conversations within the Teen Council, who wondered how or why a museum can bring out one's creativity and celebrate diversity, while also giving people an opportunity to open themselves artistically. By studying and critiquing the art and footprint that Futura 2000 has left in the Bronx, members of Teen Council opened their minds not only to the artistic culture located in their own community, but also to the long history of artists that came before them and continue to inspire them. With these reflections in mind, the Teen Council began working on what would eventually become the very zine that you hold in your hands: *The Bronx Museum Dictionary*.

The Bronx Museum Dictionary features words that embody a Bronx Museum experience through the eyes and ears of the Teen Council. Creating the zine involved discussions on the role of museums in general, but more importantly the role of The Bronx Museum in this community and how The Bronx Museum lives up to its mission statement of uplifting local artists and representing The Bronx and its artistic history.
